To support sustainable development we will:

- Encourage sustainability in planning policy: i.e. inclusion of renewable energy systems and ensuring the highest standards of energy conservation for new buildings.
- Develop renewable energy projects in Council properties and encourage communities to develop sustainable energy projects to reduce energy usage.
- Pressurise and lobby the Scottish Government to develop a policy on cumulative impact of wind turbines as soon as possible.

We will

- work to deliver a local rail service from Huntly to Laurencekirk via Aberdeen including re-development of Newtonhill Stations and a new station at Kintore
- implement measures to encourage a shift from car journeys to public transport
- Lobby for landing slots at Heathrow to be protected for flights from Aberdeen and for new air routes to Aberdeen. Work to increase the destinations from Aberdeen Airport
- deliver Road Safety initiatives to reduce accidents
- develop a modern and integrated transport network to help businesses move their goods and people; support population growth and sustain jobs and to help diversify the economy
- continue to pressurise and lobby the Scottish Government to deliver a Laurencekirk Flyover
- pressurise and lobby the Scottish Government to ensure that High Speed Rail is extended to Scotland
- investigate opportunities for use of low emission vehicles
- enforce the standards of utility company reinstatements on our road and pavements

- work with Operators to develop a fares and ticketing strategy with incentives
